Following these examples will expedite the publication of your manuscript. Common errors are highlighted in yellow.

[Note: Use en-dashes instead of hyphens for page ranges and other numeric ranges throughout the manuscript]

[Note: After colon, capitalize first letter of next word, irrespective of how it was done in the source.]

Other notes:

- Avoid citing manuscripts that have not been yet accepted for publication (such as in review or in preparation); instead, cite as pers. comm. or pers. obs.
- If two or more references have the same first and second (or third, etc) authors, in-text citation should include the second author (and other authors if needed) to differentiate them. E.g. if the following references appeared in the same manuscript:

Serb, J. M., A. E. Bogan, and C. Lydeard. 2003. Molecular phylogeny of the endangered spiny mussels of the subgenus *Canthyria* (Unionidae). *Freshwater Mollusk Conservation Society, 3rd Biennial Symposium, Program and Abstracts*. P. 25.

Serb, J. M., J. E. Buhay, and C. Lydeard. 2003. Molecular systematics of the North American freshwater bivalve genus *Quadrula* (Unionidae: Ambleminae) based on mitochondrial ND1 sequences. *Molecular Phylogenetics and Evolution* **28**: 1-11.

In the two examples above, the first in-text citation should be (Serb, Bogan and Lydeard 2003), and the second (Serb, Buhay and Lydeard 2003); neither should be (Serb *et al.* 2003).
